How can you buy or sell the sky, the warmth of the land?

If we do not own the freshness of the air and the sparkle of the water, how can you buy them?

Every part of this Earth is sacred to my people. Every shining pine needle, every sand shore, every mist in the dark woods.

Every clearing and every humming insect is holy in the memory and experience of my people.

The sap which courses through the trees carries the memories of the red man. So when the Great Chief in Washington sends word that he wishes to buy our land, He asks much of us...

Whatever befalls the Earth befalls the sons of the Earth. Man did not weave the web of life; he is merely a strand in it. Whatever he does to the web, he does to himself.

But we will consider your offer to go to the reservation you have for my people. We will live apart, and in peace.

One thing we know, which the white man may one day discover, our God is the same God. You may think now that you own Him as you wish to own our land; but you cannot. He is the god of man; and his compassion is equal for the red man and the white.

This Earth is precious to Him and to harm the Earth is to heap contempt on its Creator. The whites too shall pass; perhaps sooner that all other tribes. Continue to contaminate your bed and you will one night suffocate in your own waste...

So if we sell our land, love it as we've loved it

Care for it as we've cared for it. Hold in mind the memory of the land as it is when you take it.

And with all your strength, all your mind, and with all your heart, preserve it for your children, and love it...

As God Investus all.

One thing we know, our God is the same God.

This Earth is precious to Him.

Even the white man cannot be exempt from the common destiny.

We may be brothers after all.

We shall see.
